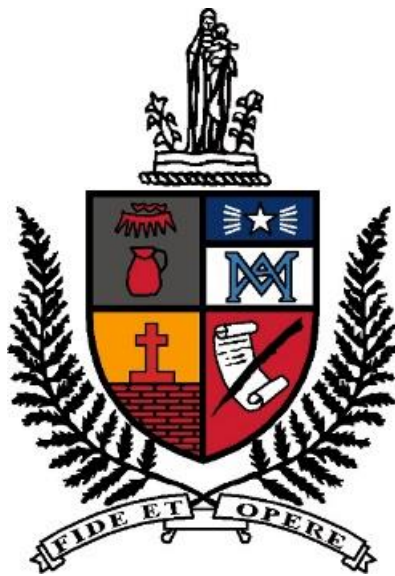

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT POLICY

Rationale

By enrolling international students, the College aims to promote internationalization, providing opportunities for students and staff from different cultures to work alongside each other in teaching and learning, providing different perspectives in order to develop each individual's understanding of other cultures. Our goal is for all our students to become connected global citizens, ready to live and work in the diverse and connected modern world.

Principles

1. To ensure the College provides programmes that are appropriate to the learning needs, abilities and stages of development of its international students.
2. To ensure effective pastoral guidance and support is provided to all its international students.
3. To ensure appropriately trained, qualified and registered staff are employed to teach the curriculum to its international students.
4. To ensure compliance with the Code of Practice for the pastoral care of international students (the Code).
5. To ensure an effective annual business and operating plan for international students is incorporated.

International Student Policy

1. St Bede's College will be compliant with all aspects of the Education (Pastoral Care of International Students) Code of Practice, 2016.
2. International Students will be enrolled at St Bede's College under a Contract of Enrolment in accordance with Section 2 of the Education Act 1989.
3. Appropriate staff and resources will be allocated by the school for the recruitment, administration and pastoral care requirements of international students.
4. There will be clear procedures in place which relate to this policy.
